#### **Principal's Message...**

#### Tēnā koutou katoa ngā Mātua

It is good to see that winter has finally arrived and our beautiful mountains have at last got their customary covering of snow. I think our school grounds must have one of the most stunning views in New Zealand.

Term 2 ended on a very successful note for our students, families and community with the outstanding production of the The Wonderful Wizard of Oz and the Year 7 and 8 Learning Celebration. My congratulations go to the teachers, students and parents who were directly involved in creating and supporting these highlights to our school programme.



This calendar for this Term is looking very full with a strong focus for senior students on NCEA and school exams, but also an active sporting and outdoor programme with the Winter Tournament and the Koru games at the end of the Term.

Congratulations to all our students who have been selected for representative sports teams and to the parents and coaches who have freely given so much of their time to contribute to their success. It is good to see so many of our students achieving a healthy balance between the sporting and academic life of the school. This week our school ski team came third in the Nelson Marlborough School Ski Championships.

We recently received our Achievement Data from the Ministry of Education and I am very pleased with the positive trends that this data shows. For example, since 2009 the percentage of students leaving with NCEA Level 2 has risen from 61.3% to 80.6% in 2015. For our Maori students it has risen from 44.4% to 83.3% in 2015. There has also been a steady rise in the number of school leavers going on to tertiary education of various kinds. There are now 40% of our students leaving our school for tertiary study and the data shows that this is consistent for boys, girls and Maori students. The national gender and ethnicity gap is not reflected in Kaikoura High School's data. The data also shows that of our students studying vocational pathways awards 100% have been successful in passing. There is a wide range of pathways offered in the fields of Construction & Infrastructure, Primary Industries, Services Industries and Creative Industries and they are a real strength to the breadth of our curriculum and the engagement of students.

We are all looking forward to another productive and enjoyable term.

## **NZQA Entry Fees**

Senior students have been given a summary of their internal and external entries for NCEA this year and information on how to apply for financial assistance for those who qualify. Application forms for financial assistance have been posted to all senior students and must be received before **Friday 26th August.** 

The amount due is \$76.70 regardless of the quantity of unit standards or achievement standards being entered for.

The final day for payment of NZQA Entry Fees to Kaikoura High School is **Friday 26 August**. After that day the late payment will have to be made to NZQA by parents and caregivers.

## **Senior Exams**

Senior examinations will run from Thursday 18th August through until Tuesday 23rd August.

These exams are run with the same rules and routines as the NCEA exams at the end of the year and these will be outlined to students prior to our internal exams. The results can be used by staff if students require a derived grade at the end of the year because they are unable to attend due to illness or bereavement etc.

Students have received the timetable and it is also available on our Facebook page and at the school office. Can you check with students to ensure they are aware of when their exams are and contact the school if they are unable to attend.

#### **Barista Course**

Thanks to Phillip from NMIT who ran a very successful Barista Course with our students.

The unit standard the students did was 17285 demonstrate



knowledge of commercial coffee equipment and prepare espresso beverages under supervision level 2, 4 credits.

The students learnt how to clean and maintain a coffee machine, froth milk, and make several different kinds of coffees. It was a 2 day course on Saturday 6 and Sunday 7 August. Feedback from the tutor was – "they came out of the course with a reasonable understanding of the coffee making process, and he was impressed with the speed in which they learnt the skills". Feedback from students was they really enjoyed it and Phillip was a great tutor.
