Principal's Message...

Tēnā koutou katoa ngā Mātua

As we approach the end of another busy term it is good to see the arrival of spring, a time for looking forward to the culmination of the year's work. Our senior students will have completed their in-school programme at the end of Week four, Term four, and most will be on study leave to sit their external examinations after that. The remainder of the year will therefore be a very focused time for them, and we all need to encourage and support them so that they can perform at their very best. I have met with Year 12 and 13 students this term and we discussed ways in which they can prepare well for exams, including the importance of study, sleep and diet. The coming holidays are an opportunity for students to have a rest and return in Term 4 well prepared for the challenge.

Congratulations to all of our sports teams who were involved in the South Island Secondary School Sports tournaments and the Koru Games. All the reports back have been very positive in acknowledging the team efforts and excellent behaviour of our students both on and off the field. Coaches and parent supporters have felt proud of our students who have represented the school and the community admirably. Thank you to everyone who has coached and supported our young people in their sports programmes over this term.

We recently conducted surveys of our students, teachers and parents to get feedback on things that are going well and areas where we need to pay more attention. The comments from all participants are overwhelmingly positive, but we have analysed the results and we will address areas that we could improve on. This will involve discussions with students, teachers and whanau. We were able to compare the results of this survey with the same surveys held in February this year and March last year. I was very pleased to see improvement in the perceptions students have of their ability to succeed and the ways teachers support them to achieve. The majority of parents who responded to the survey felt that they were provided with opportunities to contribute their knowledge and experiences to the school. My own view is that we will need to continue to work on improving these encouraging trends.

The school holidays are fast approaching and we are delighted to announce that we will be running a holiday programme in the second week: 9am-3pm, Monday 3rd - Friday 7th October at Kaikoura Primary School.
